# Knowledge Exchange Sessions

The Pacific Paravet Training Project\* (PPTP) will be hosting a series of Knowledge Exchange Sessions in mid-December. These will bring together key expertise from both research and practice to develop an understanding of context, perspectives and knowledge relevant to the following topics:

- Sociocultural perspectives on learning, pedagogical approaches and learning identities
- Formal and informal learning in community settings
- Workforce development, vocational learning and capacity building innovations
- Community engagement, community education and adult education
- Learning based on collaborative knowledge, the interface between different knowledge systems and knowledge sovereignty
- Open, distance and online learning, and the use of mobile technology in learning
- Science communication, communication for development and knowledge exchange

The following themes cut across the sessions:

- Biosecurity
- Animal, human and wildlife health
- Gender and accessibility
- Development in the Pacific
- Agriculture and extension

Though designed to identify knowledge needs and gaps for the PPTP, the Knowledge Exchange Sessions are a standalone event applicable and of use to a broader audience. There is no cost to participate as an observer in the sessions. Some participants will be invited to actively participate in the knowledge exchange process during each session.
